AMENDMENT TO THE DECLARATION OF COVENANTS, CONDITIONS AND RESTRICTIONS OF SUBURBAN GARDENS, BLOCKS 5-12 AND WILD HOLLOW SUBDIVISION, LOTS 1-15 SHERIDAN COUNTY, WYOMING

John E. Rice & Sons, Inc., d/b/a Wrench Ranch ("Declarant") retained the right to amend the Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions of Suburban Gardens, Blocks 5-12, and Wild Hollow Subdivision, Lots 1-15, located in Sheridan County, Wyoming at any time prior to the sale of 80% of the total lots within both Wild Hollow Subdivision and Suburban Gardens Subdivision, Blocks 5-12. The Declarant, therefore, amends the Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions of Suburban Gardens, Blocks 5-12 recorded with the County Clerk of Sheridan County, Wyoming in Book 376 at Page 388 and the Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions of Wild Hollow Subdivision, Lots 1-15 recorded with the County Clerk of Sheridan County, Wyoming in Book 378 at Page 301 to add the following language:

> "Notwithstanding any other provision contained in these Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions, nothing in these Covenants. Conditions or Restrictions shall prevent

development or production of oil or gas, including coal bed methane gas, so long as such exploration, development or production activities do not disturb the surface of the lands subject to these Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions."
